

Assistant Professor in Ambulatory Pharmacy Practice Evaluation

Job Description

The Faculty of Pharmacy of Université de Montréal is currently searching for an assistant professor in the field of ambulatory pharmacy practice evaluation.

Key Responsibilities

Teaching: The successful candidate will be required to teach to undergraduate and graduate students at the Faculty of Pharmacy, notably in the fields of ambulatory pharmacy practice evaluation, medication usage, medication policies, and research methods. The successful applicant will also supervise undergraduate and graduate students.

Research: The successful applicant will be required to develop and run an independent research program in ambulatory pharmacy practice in collaboration with professors of the Faculty of Pharmacy, in particular with those from the research axis "Medication and Population Health". This research program will mainly focus on pharmaceutical services, interprofessional collaboration, the management of change and innovative practices in pharmacy, evaluation of economic and political benefits of pharmaceutical care and services, and other topics deemed relevant. The successful candidate will also be required to submit an application to the Salary Support Program of the *Fonds de recherche du Québec – Santé (FRQ-S)*.

Institutional activities: The successful applicant will actively contribute to the academic growth of the Faculty by participating in the development of a new option of ambulatory pharmacy as an addition to the existing master's program in advanced pharmacotherapy.

Faculty outreach: The successful candidate will contribute to an academic environment dedicated to the advancement of their field of expertise and participate in various outreach activities, including attending conferences and committees and publishing scholarly articles.

Requirements

Candidates must have a Ph.D. in a relevant discipline with postdoctoral experience. They will be expected to demonstrate the necessary skills required to establish and maintain a career as an independent researcher in the field of ambulatory pharmacy practice. A bachelor degree in pharmacy is an asset.

At the Université de Montréal, French is the official language of work and teaching. Therefore, candidates must have good level of spoken language and understanding in French or be committed to learning the language rapidly.
